When consolidation occurred in 1968, the 14-acre park became part of the City of Jacksonville's facilities in the Department of Recreation and Public Affairs. The park consists of a 0.5-mile lighted asphalt Go-Kart track, bleachers, grills, restrooms and parking. The North Florida Kart Club has been active at the site since its early days and has helped in its maintenance and park improvements by its fund-raising efforts. In addition, the Club hosts regional and national Go-Kart races at the facility.

**History:** Our Community Club Park was originally named Old Middleburg Road Park. This original parcel of land was purchased on May 28, 1955 by the Jacksonville Heights Civic Club, Inc. In July of 1974 the land was deeded to the City of Jacksonville by the Jacksonville Heights Civic Club for recreation purposes, and called Jacksonville Heights Park. On June 12, 2002, an ordinance added 15 acres to the original 6-acre site, as well as changed the name of the park from Jacksonville Heights Park to "Our Community Club Park". The park is located at 6200 Old Middleburg Road and presently occupies 21.2 acres. Park amenities include a playscape, a picnic shelter, restrooms, 2 lighted youth baseball fields and a lighted youth softball field. Currently, plans are underway to build two additional fields on the adjacent 15-acre property.

**History:** Sal Taylor Creek Preserve includes the Sal Taylor property, which consists of 406 acres purchased on November 16, 2001 for \$1,869,000 by the City of Jacksonville, with the help of an FCT grant. FCT reimbursed \$941,157 to the City. The conceptual site plan in the FCT management plan shows parking, trails, a horseshoe pit, an exercise trail, a wildlife observation platform, and picnic areas.

**History:** The property was purchased with the help of a Florida Communities Trust grant. The Grant Award Agreement (GAA) requires kiosks, signage, picnic pavilions, a nature trail, a dirt bike trail, and a fitness trail. The GAA also requires the restoration of 120 acres of uplands and 11 acres of wetlands on the site.
